One of the names of the Lord is "El Shaddai". It means 'God Almighty' or 'God All-sufficient'.

El Shaddai is mentioned seven times in scripture, exclusively in the Old Testament and mostly in the book of Genesis. El points us to God and Shaddai is derived from the Hebrew word shad meaning "breast." God calls Himself El Shaddai because He Himself is able to meet our needs completely, satisfying us uniquely as a nursing mother does her child.

He is a God who freely gives, a God who freely sustains, a God who freely nourishes and blesses.

Shaddai is in Genesis 17:1 "When Abram was ninety-nine years old the Lord appeared to Abram and said to him, 'I am God Almighty; walk before me, and be blameless, that I may make my covenant between me and you, and may multiply you greatly.'" Abram, a childless old man, was

me, and be blameless, that I may make my covenant between me and you, and may multiply you greatly." Abram, a childless old man, was ninety-nine when God appeared to him and made a staggering promise. This God Almighty, El Shaddai, would make a covenant of multiplication between him as Abram walked before Him. The grief of barrenness had long been part of Abram's story; Sarai's arms and womb void of children. El Shaddai was spoken for the first time to Abram, a man who

no doubt had dreams for his family that did not match its reality. In God's kindness He essentially proclaims to him, "I know what you truly long for, and I'm here to satisfy you beyond every dream of what you think that will look like." God, the better fulfilment, the only All-Sufficient One—this God, our God, satisfies.

In the depths of our aches and our pains, He can meet our needs abundantly. Yes, the needs of

weakness and insufficiency in our grief. Yes, the loneliness and emptiness—the voids and doubts. Yes, the anxiety, the fears, the longing for something not

yet. God meets us here in all of this.

A Christian lady found much comfort in this name of God when facing a particularly difficult crisis in her life. "I can testify that El Shaddai is my God, he has nourished, sustained and satisfied my soul. He has met my every need, he is enough! And his grace really is sufficient and his power is made perfect in my weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9) God promises his peace and contentment when we submit our will to his, trusting El Shaddai with tomorrow, with our life!

Strengths and Weaknesses

As Christians we understand that we must repent of our selfish human ways, and that this must be an ongoing lifelong process. Perhaps naturally, our focus tends to be centred upon our weaknesses, as we feel that this is where we are most likely to find our sins.

But let's take a few minutes to focus on our strengths instead. The first thing to consider is that strengths or powers can take many forms. Some have the physical strength and energy of youth. Others may be better educated and have greater intellectual powers or force of personality. Some have greater wealth, status or authority. Others a particular talent, training or ability. Some strengths or powers are relative and may only apply in specific situations such as parenthood, the marriage relationship or the workplace - but in one context or another we all have strengths or powers relative to those around us.

The first and possibly the worst sin that can arise from our strengths is that of pride or vanity. There was once a great archangel called Lucifer. He was the supreme archangel and his name meant "Bringer of Light". But vanity over his beauty and power, led him to try to usurp the throne of Heaven and he even managed to draw one third of the angels into his conspiracy. Isaiah 14:12-15 Revelation 12:3-9. God put down his rebellion and he became "Prince of Darkness". He was renamed Satan - meaning "Enemy", and Apollyon -"Destroyer". Pride is a great sin, and the very opposite of humility.

We need to see our strengths for what they are and how they came to us. We all came into the world as naked helpless babies and we have absolutely nothing that we weren't given. 1 Timothy 6:7.



We didn't choose our nationality, our parentage, our genetic makeup, our upbringing, our education or intellectual ability, or any of the natural talents or abilities we may have. In the truest sense there is no such thing as a self-made man! Even those who wield great power and authority over others were given it from above. John 19:10-11. Measuring ourselves against others is a pointless and fruitless exercise. 2 Corinthians 10 - 12, 17-18.

Consider God, who has supreme strength, absolute power and total authority. Yet he is meek and lowly and humble of spirit. Matthew 11:28-29. He uses all his power and strength in the service of those who are weaker than himself. Yet many people use their strengths and powers selfishly, to dominate, intimidate, bully, demean, defraud and otherwise exploit or undermine those weaker than themselves.

When Christians are given the Holy Spirit, God expects our hearts to be progressively synchronised to his nature of love, and to use the strengths and talents he has given us to serve and bless others. To support the poor and weak and to be a bright light of love and kindness in a harsh cruel world. God help us humbly and faithfully to use all that we are given, in the service of God and fellow man.

The Dumfries Baptist Church Centre building and the Church Centre Ministry is a strategic part of the church's outreach to our local community.



Treasurer's Report

Total Monthly Income

November 2023 £21,190

December 2023 £19,757

These figures represent the first half of financial year 2023/24 with income 59% of budget and expenditure 46% of budget. The total Income was £164,375 (£6322 / week against a budget figure of £5400 / week). Expenditure during this same period amounted to £126,805 (£4877 / week against a budget figure of £5400 /week). The income includes £9110 for the "food parcel" ministry, which includes a grant, and expenditure £6086 for this work, a great example of outreach to the community.

We continue to notice the effects of increasing costs for many items but particularly gas, electricity and water rates. The Operating Company is particularly affected by rising food and staffing costs.

If you already give regularly, or are considering doing so, and you pay income tax (as the vast majority of us do) you can "gift-aid" your offering which effectively means the church can claim an additional 25p for every £1 you give at no additional cost to you. In the first half of the financial year over £21,700 of our offerings were **not** subject to Gift Aid. Please prayerfully consider whether you can Gift-Aid your giving. You can continue to give weekly, monthly or directly through your bank. Please contact me if you want further information regarding Gift-Aid.
