The angel said to him; "Don't be afraid,
Zechariah; your prayer has been heard; your
wife Elizabeth with bear you a son, and you are
to give him the name John." – Luke 1:13

I love this Scripture verse and the part it plays within the Christmas story. In Luke 1:5-25 we are told about Zechariah the Priest and his wife Elizabeth. Zechariah was called by God to serve in the Temple to represent the people before God. He was a man who spoke to God about the people and then spoke to the people about God. .Zechariah was grieved over the Roman oppression that he and his people suffered under and longed that they would all be set free. Zechariah remembered and believed the promise given through the prophets that one day the Messiah (the Promised One) would come and set his people free.

Zechariah and Elizabeth had no children, because Elizabeth could not conceive (v7). People within their culture would have viewed her as being a second class citizen. The gossip perhaps would be that she had done something terrible, committed some kind of sin in her past and as a result she had been cursed with barrenness. Zechariah was

probably pitied by other men, shame brought upon him because his wife could not bear children. No doubt they had longed for a child of their own, a son, to carry on the name and to provide security for Elizabeth in case something happened to Zechariah and he died. Within their culture having a son would guarantee that Elizabeth would be looked after in her old age.

As a man and a Priest when Zechariah prayed in the Temple he would have no doubt prayed earnestly for a child, a son, but perhaps he had given up hope long ago and stopped praying this prayer (v18). His focus was wholly upon praying for a Messiah to come and deliver his people. Despite all the years of disappointment and heartache Zechariah and Elizabeth had remained true to God, both of them were

upright in the sight of God, and observed all of the Lord's commands and regulations blamelessly (v6-7). Into this scene the Angel of the Lord appears to Zechariah bringing good news; "Do not be afraid, Zechariah, your prayer has been heard. Your wife Elizabeth will bear you a son, and you are to give him the name John." (Luke 1:11-13). And what an amazing gift John (the Baptist) would prove to be (v13-17).

Zechariah's response is hardly surprising! How can this be? How can you be sure of this? There are definite echoes of another older couple here, Abraham and Sarah. The promise given to Abraham was that ALL peoples of the earth would be blessed through his faith; but how was this going to happen, since he and Sarah had no children? In their old age God gave Abraham and Sarah the gift of a son, Isaac, and so this made sure that the promise of God would be fulfilled through Abraham's

offspring.

Little did Zechariah and Elizabeth realise that they were in on this great story of God's promise! Two answers to prayer! Their son, John the Baptist, would prepare the way for Jesus, the Messiah! The Messiah would eventually come through Mary, Elizabeth's cousin. John the Baptist would be in part the

fulfilment of the words of the prophets Isaiah (40:3) and Micah (3:1) ... but of course Jesus would be the ultimate fulfilment of the promise given to Abraham. The angel of the Lord announced the Messiah's birth; "Do not be afraid. I bring you good news of great joy that will be for ALL the people. Today in the town of David a Saviour has been born to you; he is Christ, the Lord." Isn't it just like God to give Zechariah so much more than he prayed for! Not just a son, but a son who would prepare the way for the Messiah.

With all that is going on within the lives of so many of our church family as a direct result of illness, cancer treatment, loss and bereavement let's hold on to this wonderful truth this Christmas from Luke 1:13... "Do not be afraid, your prayer has been heard."






Home-Start Dumfries is responsible

Calside Primary School are holding their Christmas Performance here


during the second week of December.

### **An Open Invitation**

I'm not really a party animal, but there is one party I really do not want to miss. It's a very auspicious occasion - a huge banquet in celebration of a royal wedding - so it's a real privilege to be invited. You can read the announcement in Luke 14:16-24 and Matthew 22:1-14, and you're invited too.

ith royalty present there is naturally a strict dress code, and anyone not conforming to the published dress code will be barred from attending. For instance, we have to be clothed with Humility, (1 Peter 5:5) but you can't buy that on the High Street. There are other required garments too, none of them a common brand, and all quite costly. However our host has promised to provide everything we need via his supply agent the Holy Spirit. In fact all the garments we need are available via the Holy Spirit, and here are some other garments we've been told we must wear: Mercy, Kindness, Meekness, Patience and Forgiveness. Colossians 3:12-14. We need Faith and a belt made of Truth, and the host has even specified footwear which is the Preparation of the Gospel of Peace. Ephesians 6:14-15. The most vital and important top-garment is Love. We are to request these necessary garments, and then put them on.

The host has also made it clear that there are things we must not wear - even underneath all these lovely garments which we do have to wear. Lying is a definite nono; also bitterness, rage and anger, thieving, rowdiness, malice and bad language. Ephesians 4:25-31.

uests will be pre-vetted for their behavioural standards. Fornication, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, seditions and heresies, envying, drunkenness and intemperance will not be tolerated.

What is required is love, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, kindness, faith, meekness and temperance - Galatians 5:19-24. After all, the host wants this magnificent banquet to be a wonderfully joyful, happy and harmonious occasion for all. He wants everyone present to fully embrace the joyous festivities celebrating the royal wedding.

urprisingly, many who were invited have turned down the invitation. Apparently some weren't interested or said they were too busy, while others had prior commitments which they felt were more important. The host is understandably very miffed to have had his wonderful invitation rejected, so he has thrown open the invitation to others. We can invite friends and family and anyone else we meet to fill the vacant spaces. In fact the invitation is open to anyone who will respond, provided they are willing to accept the dress code, and they'll need to be washed and cleaned up first of course.

# Is there anything specific that we can pray for you now or in the coming months?



### **Treasurer's Report**

Total Monthly Income

September 2003 £26,648.97

October 2003 £36.939.16 (includes Tax Refund)

These figures represent the first third of financial year 2023/24 with income 40% budget and expenditure 30% of budget. The total Income was £123,387 (£6512 / week against a budget figure of £5400,/,week). Expenditure during this same period amounted to £84,307 (£4683 /vweek against a budget figure of £5400 / week ) . The income includes £8,090 for the "food parcel" ministry, which includes a grant, and expenditure £3910 for this work, a great example of outreach to the community

We continue to notice the effects of increasing costs for many items but particularly gas, electricity and water rates. The Operating Company is particularly affected by rising food and staffing costs.

If you already give regularly, or are considering doing so, and you pay income tax (as the vast majority of us do) you can "gift-aid" your offering which effectively means the church can claim an additional 25p for every £1 you give at no additional cost to you. This past year over £34,500 of our offerings were **not** subject to Gift Aid. Please prayerfully consider whether you can Gift-Aid your giving. You can continue to give weekly, monthly or directly through your bank. Please contact me if you want further information regarding Gift-Aid.
